

DEATH OF A. K. BROWN.

He Expired Suddenly From Heart Disease Saturday Night.

Col. Alfred K. Brown, of Richford, a prominent member of the Franklin county bar, died suddenly from heart disease, at his home at 11 o'clock Saturday night.

Alfred K. Brown was born in Sheldon May 14, 1859. He was educated in the common schools and at the famous Burr and Burton seminary at Manchester, Vt., graduating in 1876. He studied law at Dartmouth college and Ann Arbor university, following which he entered the law office of Hon. C. P. Hogan, then at Sheldon and completing his course, was admitted to bar at the September term of 1882.

He was assistant secretary of the senate at the sessions of 1882 and 1884. In 1888 he was elected state's attorney for Franklin county, and was re-elected in 1890.

In 1892 he represented Richford in the house of representatives. Col. Brown was captain of the old Richford company in the Vermont National Guard for several years. Gov. Grout made him a member of his staff with the rank of colonel in October.

In January, 1883, Col. Brown commenced the practice of law in Richford with Hon. E. Henry Powell, which partnership existed until Mr. Powell's removal to Burlington a few years ago.

Col. Brown was married in 1882 to Miss Nellie Smith, of East Berkshire. His widow, three sons, and two brothers, O. K. Brown, of Swanton, and Dr. E. M. Brown, of Sheldon, and his aged mother survive him.

The funeral will be held to-morrow at 1 o'clock in the afternoon.
