Col. Alfred K. Brown of Richford died very suddenly Saturday night at 11 o'clock of heart disease. Alfred K. Brown was born in Sheldon May 14, 1859. He was educated in the common schools and at Burr and Burton seminary at Manchester, graduating in 1876. He studied law at Dartmouth college and Ann Arbor university, following which he entered the law office of C. P. Hogan, then at Sheldon, and completing his course, was admitted to the bar at the September term of 1882. He was assistant secretary of the Senate in the session of 1882 and 1884. In 1888 he was elected state's attorney for Franklin county, and was re-elected in 1890. In 1892 he represented Richford in the House of Representatives. Col. Brown was much interested in military matters and affairs, and was captain of the Richford company for several years. His ability commended him to Gov. Grout, who, in October, made him a member of his staff with the rank of colonel. In January, 1883, Col. Brown began the practice of law in Richford with E. Henry Powell, which partnership existed until Mr. Powell's removal to Burlington a few years ago. Col. Brown was married in 1882 to Miss Nellie Smith of East Berkshire. His widow, three sons and two brothers survive him.
