**Opening of Another Year at the
University of Vermont.**

**Engineering Courses Attract the Major-
ity of the Freshmen—Sopho-
mores Post Rules for Members
of Entering Class.**

One hundred and ten students from six States, 17 of whom are from this city, 86 from this State, 11 from Massachusetts, seven from New Hampshire, two each from Wisconsin and New York State and two from Maine, matriculated into the academical department of the University of Vermont at the opening of a new year yesterday. Several new students from other institutions have entered with advanced standing.

The customary opening exercises were held in the chapel at 8:15 in the morning, attended by a majority of the new students and many of the old. The exercises were in charge of Prof. J. E. Goodrich and appropriate remarks were made. President Buckham's usual talk to the new students being postponed until his return from Scotland.

All day students were enrolling in their classes at the various places apportioned for that purpose and the hour plan will go into force this morning.

The new class is divided into courses as follows:

Latin scientific, 21; civil engineering, 18; electrical engineering, 17; mechanical engineering, 11; commerce and economics, 10; classical, nine; chemical and agricultural, eight each; special five; while four have not yet selected their courses.
