



R. J. Luke Files Suit Against Jacob Kaufman in District Court -Wants \$10,385

Yesterday, through his attorneys, Grimstad and Brown, R. J. Luke, filed suit for damages against Jacob Kaufman for the sum of \$10,385. The complaint states that on January 9th, 1913, the defendant without cause and with intent to injure the good name of the plaintiff, wrongully charged him with larceny and filed an information to plaintiff, wrongfully charged him with larceny and filed an information to that effect before Justice of Peace Smith of Biflings. That on January 31, 1913 the palintiff was arested and that he was tried upon the fifth day of Febraury and discharged, the cause being dismissed.

The complaint further states that the charge was entirely false and that the plaintiff has suffered injury to his good name as a result of the public

the plaintiff has suffered injury to his good name as a result of the public lignominy and contempt and that he has undergone extreme mental suffering for which he demands damages to the extent of \$10,000.

The complaint further states that the plaintiff was forced to employ legal services of Nichols and Wilson at the time of the hearing at a cost of \$200, and that he traveled from California to Billings at his own expense as a result of the charges to allow the service of the papers of arrest at a cost to him of \$185. The plaintiff demands damages to the extent of \$10,385 and costs. \$10,385 and costs.
