

TATE HEADS REPUBLICAN CLUB, HARRIS POKES FUN AT DEMOS

C. L. Harris paid his compliments to President Wilson's policies and the Democratic congress at a meeting held in Kennedy hall last night to organize a Republican club for the present campaign.

The following were elected as officers of the club: President, R. H. Tate; vice president, Rockwood Brown; secretary, John Edy.

Mr. Harris charged that the Democratic party had violated its platform promises, declaring Pres. Wilson before election said the Democratic plank

pledging exemption of Panama tolls on American coastwise shipping was "not molasses to catch flies," but that after his election, Wilson reversed himself and forced congress to repeal free tolls.

He contended that world market conditions caused the present high price of wool, and declared that if such fortunate natural conditions had not arisen, the Democratic party's policy of free trade would have ruined the sheep industry throughout the country. He contrasted present busi-
