

U. S. MUST SUPPLY WOOL FOR WORLD; HIGH PRICES ASSURED FOR 10 YEARS

South America Clip Eliminated as Competitive Factor, Asserts J. D. Holliday--England Controls Supply Outside of U. S.

With the armies of a dozen warring nations of Europe, Asia and Africa crying for meat, while the stricken countries are prevented by war's devastations from keeping up meat production or rebuilding slaughtered herds, and with the spindles of half the civilized world quiet unless they can get American wool, the American sheepmen is assured of at least ten years of the highest wool and mutton prices in the history of the industry, according to John D. Holliday, president of the National Wool Warehouse & Storage company.

England's embargo has forced the wool of Australia, New Zealand and South Africa to her looms, Mr. Holliday declares, and the other nations must depend on the United States for their supply during the progress of the war and probably for a number of years afterward.

These conditions necessitate the building up of sheep herds in the western states, and the sheep industry is being revived in numerous sections of Colorado, Idaho, New Mexico, Arizona, Idaho and Montana, where it had practically died out or was at a low ebb, he avers.
