

**TO SHOW ACTUAL BATTLE  
SCENES FOR BENEFIT  
OF AMBULANCE SERVICE**

M. M. Palmer, general secretary of the American Ambulance society in France, and Lieutenant George H. Roeder, secretary of section two of the American field ambulance service in France, are in the city, and the latter, who has the distinction of being the first American to receive the Croix de Guerre, or war cross, will deliver two illustrated lectures for the benefit of the service. The first will be given at the Babcock theater Friday afternoon, and will be open to the general public, a small admission fee being charged. In the evening an invitation lecture will be given at the American theater.

The purpose in touring the country is to secure funds for the ambulance service, which, as is known, is cared for by Americans. The members of the service have grown with the continuation of the war, and it has become necessary to secure funds for its continuation.

At both afternoon and evening lectures, pictures taken on the various European battlefields will be shown. Wherever the film, "Our American Boys in the European War" has been shown, including such cities as New York, New Orleans, Nashville, Philadelphia and elsewhere, the press comment has been most favorable.
