

LITTLE CHANGE IS REPORTED IN FLU SITUATION

Red Cross Appeals for Nurses and Helpers

One more death, that of John Todd, Jr., from influenza, was reported in Billings in the 24 hours ending at Sunday noon. Aside from this the Spanish influenza situation remains about the same here. No new cases have been reported to the board of health since Saturday when it was estimated that there were approximately 1,000 victims of the epidemic in the city.

Saturday night, one of the boys who was taken from the train while en route from Newport, Ark., to Vancouver Barracks, Wash., was reported to have taken a turn for the worse and pneumonia had set in. His condition was still serious Sunday. Dr. Allard, health officer, who was taken with the disease more than a week ago, was reported to be rapidly recovering Sunday.

The Red Cross has been calling for nurses to register in order to help take care of new victims. Up to Sunday night only a few had responded. The society has also received a number of gauze masks which may be had free by persons attending victims of influenza upon application at Red Cross headquarters on the second floor of the Hart-Albin building.
