

MONTANA CORN CROP IS GOOD

Farmers Tell Grimstad Representatives Must Spend Less Money.

O. K. Grimstad, who is a candidate for the nomination of state senator on the Republican ticket in Yellowstone county, has returned from a business trip to Ingomar and the surrounding country, and brings back glowing reports of the splendid prospects that the farmers and livestock men of that territory have for a bumper year.

Mr. Grimstad went to Ingomar to represent the depositors of the First National bank of that city in a plan for reorganization. He is a member of a committee of three appointed to draw up the plans for reopening the bank, and said Monday that those plans would be completed before the end of the week.

Mr. Grimstad has extensive sheep interests near Ingomar. He said Monday that the lambs would come off the range from three to five pounds heavier this year than they have any past year for more than a decade. He also visited his irrigated farm near Custer on his trip and found the crops in splendid condition.

"I have never seen better crops than are to be seen in that vicinity," Mr. Grimstad said. "The corn crop is certainly unusual and is up to any crop I have ever seen in any of our so-called 'corn states.' The corn is now in silk and we will be having roasting ears in two weeks."

While talking with many of the farmers Mr. Grimstad found that they are interested in seeing a man elected to represent them who will spend more time and less money in giving them the representation they desire. They feel that the way to reduce taxes is to cut out a lot of the useless spending of money.
