

## BROWN CHOSEN PRIMARY CHIEF FOR COOLIDGE

Senator Burlingame  
Names Billings Law-  
yer; Vermonter Like  
President He Backs.

Rockwood Brown, member of the law firm of Grimstad & Brown, of this city, was Friday named director for Yellowstone county of the Coolidge primary campaign which is being organized for the support of the candidacy of President Coolidge for the Republican nomination for president. The appointment was made by former State Senator J. M. Burlingame of Great Falls, who is director for Montana of the Coolidge campaign. Mr. Burlingame, who came to Billings for the express purpose of making the appointment, announced his selection after numerous conferences with Republican leaders in this county.

Mr. Brown, like President Coolidge, is a native of Vermont. He has been a resident of Billings for a number of years and has been an active worker in the Republican party. He will, within a few days, name an executive committee to act with him. Mrs. May Burrows of Helena, who is the Montana director of the woman's Coolidge campaign, will name a woman director for Yellowstone county, according to Mr. Burlingame.

Before coming here Senator Burlingame stopped in Livingston and after conferring with Republican leaders there, announced the appointment of Harry M. Shelber, of that city, as director for Park county. Senator Burlingame has been working out organization plans for some time and while in Billings said that organization has been so far perfected in 30 Montana counties, and directors named in each of them. He left here Friday night for Helena.

Senator Burlingame said that the Coolidge sentiment is pronounced in every section of the state that he has visited, and that there is no indication that there will be any worthwhile opposition to his candidacy among the Republicans of Montana.

Speaking of conditions in northern Montana, Mr. Burlingame said that the weather for the last six weeks has been more favorable to a good crop year than any he had ever seen at a similar period in Montana, and that business conditions in Great Falls reflect the optimism felt at the unusual prospects for a bumper harvest. \*\*\*
