Stage Set for Big Aerial Circus on Rimrocks Today

Parade of 20 Planes Over Billings at 12:30 o'Clock Will Open Monster Lindbergh Day Celebration; Thousands Expected to Pack New Airport; Many Outside Pilots Will Participate

A parade of fifteen to twenty planes over Billings at 12:30 and an aerial circus starting promptly at 2 o'clock Sunday afternoon are on the program for the celebration of Lindbergh day in Billings. Following the announcement of a week ago that options had been secured for an aviation field site on the rimrocks, affording 400 acres for a landing field, plans were immediately made for a suitable celebration of Lindbergh day here, commemorating the start of the famed transatlantic flyer on his hop across the ocean.

Pilots and aviation firm representatives from all parts of Montana as well as from points outside the state were extended invitations to participate in the event. The response by telegram the first few days after the aerial circus was announced was more than gratifying and the aviation committee of the Billings Commercial club anticipates a record crowd at the field on the rimrocks from which the circus will be staged.

A nominal admission charge will be made and money derived from the circus will go toward immediate improvements on the newly secured field. Tickets to the circus will be on sale downtown starting at 9 o'clock in the morning, and they may also be purchased on the road to the field.

One Way Traffic.
The highway leading to the field will be a one-way road from 1 to 3 o'clock.

Mr. Mulvaney will have charge of the traffic up and down the landing field drive. Members of the police department and of the sheriff's office will have charge of the policing, assisted by the American Legion. V. D. Caldwell will have charge of ticket sales.

From Outside of State.
Pilots and other aviation enthusiasts, who will be here from all over Montana and outside the state, will be invited to remain in the city over Monday and the rest of the week if they desire. The Rotary club will have them as guests Monday noon and they will be entertained at the benefit dance to be held at the Aldrome Monday evening.

Many of the planes participating in the circus Sunday were in town Saturday night. An invitation was sent to the Central Montana Airways of Lewistown and it is probable that it will be represented at the circus. Clarence Urie of Livingston will be here, according to an acceptance wired the aviation committee of the club in response to an invitation. Tom Clark and Martin Zollman are also expected to be here from Livingston. The Harlowton Airways company had not informed the aviation committee definitely Saturday as to whether it would be represented. Jack Heidecker of Roundup will be here with a plane, he
