

**PROGRESSIVE STEP  
TAKEN BY HIGHWAY  
COMMISSION HERE**

**WILL ERECT SIGNS AT  
HISTORIC SPOTS IN  
THE STATE**

One of the first progressive steps to be taken by the new Montana highway commission will be the placing of picturesque and adequate markers at all points of historic interest along or near the highways of the state. It was announced yesterday by E. B. Donohue, maintenance engineer for the commission.

**Will Co-operate**

The commission, composed of Dr. Harry McGregor of Great Falls, chairman; L. J. Croonenberghs of Missoula and Rockwood Brown of Billings, will co-operate in every possible way with the movement under way to make the state more attractive to the tourists and to advertise its many outstanding attributes.

The maintenance department of the commission is busy at the present time preparing historical data for the signs to be erected under the new program. It is planned to construct preliminary signs, explaining the approach of a historical spot or location, and to be followed with the regular signs relating briefly the high lights of the area and its historical significance.

**Lewis and Clark**

Markers will follow the great exploration of Lewis and Clark through Montana, noteworthy accomplishments of other great explorers and pioneers will be noted, and the battles of the white with the Indian which paved the way for the civilization of the West, will be apparently designated by colorful signs, Mr. Donohue said.

The frames will be constructed of red cedar posts and cross beams and the signs, to be suspended from the cross beam by chains, will consist of white oak with dark lettering, the maintenance engineer said. Work of erecting the signs will be started at once and it is the hope of the commission, Mr. Donohue said, to have the job completed this summer.
