

## DAMAGE SUITS SEEK \$55,500

### Sheep Firm Named in Actions Based on Auto Collision.

Two damage suits asking judgments amounting altogether to \$55,500 and naming as defendant the G-B Sheep company, of which Rockwood Brown is secretary, were filed in district court Friday afternoon by Ruby Straight, a waitress, and Lewis G. Brannon, proprietor of the Brannon cafe.

The suits are the result of an accident November 8, last, on First avenue north and Thirty-first street, in which cars driven by Mr. Brown and Mr. Brannon collided. Ruby Straight, a passenger in Brannon's car, asks for \$25,000 to compensate her for the physical injuries she claims to have received and \$3,000 for doctor and hospital bills. Mr. Brannon also asks for \$25,000 for the physical injuries he claims to have sustained as the result of the accident and \$2,500 for doctor and hospital bills.

Among the physical injuries Ruby Straight claims are a paralyzed arm and a fractured nose. Mr. Brannon claims to have received a spinal injury.

The complaints set forth the G-B Sheep company as owner of the car which Mr. Brown was driving. They allege Mr. Brown violated that section of the city traffic ordinances which provides that automobiles before entering through streets, must come to a complete stop.
