

BILLINGS MAN IS APPOINTED TO WATER BOARD

Rockwood Brown Is
Named as Successor
to I. D. O'Donnell,
Who Resigned Post.

Helena, April 27.—(AP)—Gov. Roy E. Ayers Tuesday appointed two new state water conservation commissioners and reappointed a third.

The governor named O. S. Warden, Great Falls publisher and president of the National Reclamation association, and Rockwood Brown, Billings attorney, as members of the state water conservation board to succeed I. D. O'Donnell, of Billings, and Grover Lewis, of Glendive, whose resignations he accepted Tuesday.

D. P. Fabrick, of Choteau, was reappointed. He has served on the board since it was created by the special session of the legislature in 1934. His term expired in January. His new term ends in January, 1943.

Commissioner Warden will serve out the unexpired term of Lewis which ends the second Monday in January, 1939.

Commissioner Brown will complete the unexpired portion of O'Donnell's appointment, ending on the second Monday in January, 1941.

With Governor Ayers, ex-officio chairman, presiding members of the board with the exception of Commissioner Warden, who is in Washington, D. C., will meet Wednesday to organize. State Engineer J. S. James is secretary.

Commissioner Fabrick and Engineer James are scheduled to leave for Washington by airplane after Wednesday's meeting, to confer with Commissioner Warden on expedition of allocations for approved Montana water conservation projects.
