

Local Man Dies During Dash To Reach Bus

Heart Attack Fatal
To Retired Butcher
After Hospital Visit

A one-block sprint to catch a bus proved fatal here Saturday night to John C. Farrell, about 65, retired butcher and resident of Billings for the last 18 months.

Farrell's body was found lying on the sidewalk in front of C. J. Williams' residence, 3021 Twelfth avenue north, at 9:25 p. m. by three boys. A physician, visiting in the neighborhood, pronounced Farrell dead, evidently of a heart attack.

Police theorized that Farrell had been visiting his 67-year-old wife at St. Vincent hospital, had missed the bus as it passed the hospital on Thirtieth street and was running to catch it on Thirty-first when he was stricken. A bus token lay beside the body. Mrs. Farrell fell from a stool in a local lunchroom March 13 and received a broken hip. She has been in the hospital since.

The body was found by Tom Heald, Rockwood Brown and Wiley Johnston, all local students.

Farrell had been residing at 2223 First avenue north, since late last summer. Friends said that he came here from Rochester, Minn., where he had been receiving medical treatment. He is known to have a brother, Jim Farrell, in Pine Ridge, S. D., and a sister in Chadron, Neb.
