

Brown Heads Fair Board

Exposition Directors Hold Annual Meeting

Rockwood Brown was elected president of the Midland Empire fair board at the annual organization meeting of directors in the board's office in the Securities building Monday.

Ora F. Kemp was elected first vice president and C. M. Hoiness was named second vice president. The other directors on the board are Emmett Vaughn and E. J. Maynard.

Brown, Hoiness and Maynard are new members of the board of directors, succeeding John W. Currie, Ben E. Cardwell and John W. Foste, who resigned this fall.

The new board of directors Monday retained Harry L. Pitton as secretary-manager of the Midland Empire exposition.

At the board meeting Monday directors were named to supervise the 30 departments of the 1942 fair which is scheduled in Billings August 10 to 15. The exposition program next year will be a silver anniversary event, marking the twenty-fifth year of operation. The Midland Empire fair has been staged annually since 1916, with the exception of two years, 1933-34, when it was discontinued.

Directors and the fair departments they will supervise at the 1942 exposition were announced as follows:

Vaughn—Draft horses, poultry, eggs and pet stock, swine, Indian exhibits and Indian boys and girls departments, first and second class schools and Indian schools.

Kemp—Agriculture, horticulture, 4-H agriculture clubs, 4-H home economics clubs, rural and third class schools, rodeo.

Maynard—Show horses, beef cattle, dairy cattle, 4-H livestock exhibits, Future Farmers of America livestock exhibits, machinery displays.

Brown—Floriculture, art, needlework, culinary, horse races, pari-mutuels and independent midway.

Hoiness—Outside gates, grandstand gates, bleacher gates, mercantile displays, fine arts and crafts, carnival attractions.
