

Resources Board Maps Meetings

Helena, Sept. 27.—(P)—The Montana resources development board, created by the 1949 legislature, Tuesday divided the state into three districts for a series of public meetings.

Those interested in the development of Montana will be asked to bring their suggestions to the meetings, to be scheduled later.

Rockwood Brown of Billings, appointed board chairman Tuesday by Governor John W. Bonner, will have the district from Lewistown south. Jack C. Toole of Shelby will direct meetings in the area north of Lewistown. T. J. Sullivan of Butte will have the "Rocky mountain area," the continental divide and west.

Among those who appeared before the board Tuesday was Hans Sarbach of West Yellowstone. He told conferees winter sports may be developed into one of Montana's major industries. Sarbach, director of a ski development at West Yellowstone, said it is proposed to make a major winter sports center of that area.
