

Lawyer Asks \$444 From N. P. Railway

Rockwood Brown, Billings attorney, seeks to recover \$444.82 from the Northern Pacific railway in an action filed in district court Wednesday and based on drouth shipping rates of 1934 and 1935.

The complaint states that Brown paid \$489.50 to the railway Jan. 2, 1935, for shipping 14 carloads of feeder stock sheep from Myers to Park City. He shipped 13 carloads of feeder stock sheep from Park City to Myers on April 1, 1935 and paid the railway company \$464.32, according to the complaint.

Brown alleges that he obtained a drouth rate shipping permit from the state department of agriculture. In addition to the \$444.82, he asks interest on \$366.32 at a rate of 6 per cent per annum from Jan. 2, 1935, and on \$78.50 from April 1, 1935.
