

Montana Republican Leaders Attacked by Senator Wheeler

Washington. — (AP) — Montana republican leaders were charged in the senate Monday by Senator Wheeler, democrat, Montana, with conferring here with a view to "getting rid of a dry district attorney and getting a prohibition agent amenable to the view of the republican leaders of the state."

Wheeler said J. A. Schnitzler, republican national committeeman, and Rockwood Brown, chairman of the republican state committee, were in Washington, conferring, among others, "with that notorious wet, Paddy Wallace, from my state."

"They are here," he asserted, "first for the purpose of selecting a candidate against Senator Walsh, a democrat, secondly, to seek the ouster of the district attorney, and next conferring over a prohibition agent."

Schnitzler said to day he had recommended the reappointment of Wellington Rankin as district attorney. He said conferences have been held over the seantorial race but that no announcements were expected for several days. The Montanians have been in conference with Chairman Moses, of the republican senatorial committee.
