

Rosebud Shearing Season at Height

Forsyth, June 19.—(Special)—The sheep shearing season is nearing its height in Rosebud county, work at the big Ingomar plant being in full way in addition to numerous other small plants in operation throughout this region.

That the sheep industry has made a rapid comeback in this section is indicated at the Ingomar plant which this year expects to be in operation three weeks in contrast to a few days last shearing season. An average of 2,000 sheep a day are being handled there this year.

Barley Brothers, who have large range holdings on the north side and who three years ago disposed of their bands with the intention of restocking their ranges at a more favorable season, are again running several bands. They are among those reported finished with shearing.

The Rockwood Brown clip, sheared at Stellar creek, is reported at 160 bags. Others reported to have completed shearing are Freeman Philbrick, John Gray, H. S. Withington and C. S. Patterson.
