

### SHEARING IN FULL SWING IN ROSEBUD

Forsyth, June 24.—Sheepshearing throughout Rosebud county is in full swing, the fleeces being of a high grade. Shearers at the Ingomar pens are turning out around 1,200 clips a day. Numerous small outfits are shearing on the north side as well as in the southern part of the county.

The Win Burlison sheepshearing crew finished work Monday at the Minkoff pens near Cohagen and are now at work at the Lloyd pens on Sunday creek where they have 6,000 sheep to shear.

Barley brothers are shearing at their pens on the Little Porcupine. The Falck crew is doing the work, having finished the Collins sheep last week.

The Will Mitchell machine shearing crew arrived Friday from Sand Springs and is at work on the Freeman Philbrick sheep at the ranch on the Rosebud.

The Rockwood Brown wool is being trucked from its shearing pens on the upper Stellar creek. Ole Eik and C. C. Edwards are also shipping from Forsyth, having sheared south of here.

Wallace Ulmer sheared at the Barley brothers pens on the Little Porcupine. This wool was shipped from Forsyth. The F. V. H. Collins' clip, barely short of 100,000 pounds, was sheared at Cartersville and brought here for shipment.

Most of the wool is said to be going out on consignment.
