

HISTORY SOCIETY IS FORMED HERE

Appoint Council to
Carry on Until Annual
Meet This Fall.

An association to be known as the Montana Society of Natural History was formally organized at a dinner meeting held in the Northern hotel tea room Sunday afternoon. Called by Dr. H. Melville Sayre of the Montana State School of Mines faculty at Butte, the meeting was attended by 36 men and women from various points throughout the state.

Twenty-five letters were received from persons interested in affiliating with the society, but who were unable to attend the organization dinner.

The society will be interested in anthropology, geology, biology, paleontology and social history. Four general objectives were adopted. They are:

To stimulate interest in natural and social history in Montana.

To stimulate closer relationship between professional and amateur workers and the public.

To guide the interest and cooperation of members in the field of natural and social history.

To advocate the conservation and preservation of important data in the above fields.

A general council was appointed to carry on the organization work until the first annual meeting which will be held November 27 and 28, the two days following Thanksgiving of this year, at Helena. Dr. Sayre was elected chairman of the council to act until the annual meeting; George Shea of
