

# LAUREL GROUP PROTESTS MOVE

## Question Legality of City Building 25 Tourist Cabins.

Laurel, Dec. 9.—(Special)—Appearing before the city council Tuesday evening, F. E. Jacobson, representing a large group of Laurel taxpayers, and Rockwood Brown, Billings attorney retained as counsel, protested the legality of the building of approximately 25 tourist cabins in Riverside park at the instigation of the city council for leasing and commercial gains.

Mr. Jacobson stated, 'that it was their express purpose to have the building of the tourist cabins in our city owned park for housing purposes discontinued, and are prepared, upon advice of counsel, to advance further actions for restraint if, and after, city council does not make favorable response to our claim.'

The city council took the matter under advisement, referring it to B. L. Price, city attorney.
