

## Honors Pass To Residents Of This Area

A number of Billings and Midland Empire residents merited the "honor roll" during 1937, with appointments and elections to various prominent and responsible positions.

One of the chief honors received by a Billings man during the year was the election of George E. Snell as vice president of Kiwanis International at that organization's annual convention in Indianapolis, Ind., on June 24.

Mrs. Anna W. Smalley of Roundup also was signally honored at Indianapolis in September, when she was installed as most worthy grand matron of the grand chapter of the Order of Eastern Star.

Several Billings men received political appointments during the year. W. B. Vaughan, vice president of the Security Trust & Savings bank, was named to the Montana liquor control board by Governor Ayers in February and served until June 19, when he submitted his resignation because of the press of private business.

### On Highway Commission.

Grover C. Cise, Billings lawyer and chairman of the Democratic state central committee, was named in April to the state highway commission, but resigned shortly thereafter. He was succeeded by another Billings man, John N. Wheeler, a member of the real estate firm of Wheeler Bros., Inc.

Rockwood Brown, Billings lawyer, was named to the Montana state water conservation board in April to succeed I. D. O'Donnell, also of Billings, who resigned.

Among other eastern Montana men on the honor roll in 1937 were:

Carl Thompson, Roundup, named assistant state attorney general by Attorney General H. J. Freshour.

Harry Snyder, Billings, reelected president of the Montana Wool Growers association at the group's annual meeting in Billings in January.

E. R. Albin, Billings merchant, named a member of the executive committee of the National Business association.

W. F. Roscoe, Billings, elected president of the newly-formed Montana Contractor's association.
