

Billings Is Ready for League Post

HELENA, Mont., Nov. 5 (AP)—Articles of incorporation have been filed with the Montana secretary of state for the Billings Pioneer Baseball club.

Capitalization is listed as \$100,000. The Pioneer Baseball league, embracing six cities in Utah and Idaho, has voted to expand by granting franchises at Billings and Great Falls.

Directors of the Billings club are A. M. Cochrane, Rockwood Brown, Russell B. Hart, H. L. Faxon, Larry O. Hennett, L. V. Cartar, A. H. Langman, H. H. Perigo and Robert E. Cooke, all of Billings, and Robert H. Cobb of Hollywood, Calif., and Gordon S. Cochrane of Detroit.

Cobb is vice president of the Hollywood Stars of the Pacific Coast league. He identified Gordon Cochrane as Mickey, the former Detroit and Philadelphia Athletics' catcher.

Cobb said Hollywood planned to assign 19 players to Billings for training purposes each season. He lauded the work of Billings men in laying groundwork for the club.

He said he met with the Billings group several weeks ago, adding:

They underwrote \$40,000 of the \$60,000 it will cost to fix up the ball park in five minutes. I agreed to provide the other \$20,000.
