

Rockwood Brown, Billings Attorney, Is Elected President of Mustangs

Rockwood Brown, Billings attorney, was elected president of the Billings Pioneer league baseball club, at a meeting of the board of directors Tuesday.

Brown, vice president of the club in 1953, succeeds P. A. Thomson. Thomson was named league director of the Mustangs, succeeding R. R. Jones.

Les Carter was elected Mustang vice president at the meeting. W. J. O'Brien was again named secretary and R. M. Waters was re-elected treasurer.

Reappointment of Maury Enright as business manager of the club was announced following the directors meeting.

The directors meeting followed the annual stockholders meeting Monday night in the Northern ho-

tel when Brown, Russ B. Hart, Archie Cochrane and R. E. Cooke were re-elected directors.

Also announced at the stockholders meeting was a raise in general admissions from 75 cents to 85 cents per person. The raise, it was pointed out, brings the Mustangs in line with other clubs in the class C league which operates in eight cities in Utah, Idaho and Montana.
