

Richard Brown, 7, son of Mr. and Mrs. Keith Brown of 1535 Burlington Ave., found this out when he toured the "dark and bloody" ground with a YMCA day camp group from Billings.

Richard, walking over the ground covered by Major Reno's retreat, discovered a tarnished cartridge case in the grass at his feet. National Park Service attendants, to whom Richard reported his find, said it was of the type fired in Springfield rifles used in Battle of the Little Big Horn.

Since all battlefield relics are considered government property, the casing was left in the museum for display purposes.
