

Mayor Names Caves Board

Billings — likely the only city in the country with a caves commission—saw commission members named Monday.

Mayor Willard Fraser announced an appointive lineup of six regular and two ex-officio members.

Chairman is Dr. Wilson Clark of Eastern Montana College, an Indian Caves supporter.

Other members are Chester Brooks of the National Parks Service; Ted Wirth, landscape architect; Harold Hagen, president of the Billings Archeological Society; Conna May of the Dude Ranchers Association; and Rockwood Brown Jr., the city's park board chairman.

City Attorney Stuart Conner and Alderman Henry Cox will be ex-officio members.

Council confirmation of the nominees will come up Tuesday.

Commissioners will sift all offers of volunteer development help at the Indian Caves south of the city.

The caves have been a controversial subject for many weeks since Fraser signed Montana Highway Department "use

permit" which gives the city development rights.

The council rejected this permit but last week gave Fraser authority to set up the caves commission.

No action on obtaining a lease, deed, etc., on the caves will come until the council reviews cave commission findings.
