If John Q. Homeowner wants the park department to start sprucing up a park across the street from his Billings Heights home before working on a West Billings park, he should write a letter.

So advises Rockwood Brown Jr., park commission chairman.

"If people have requests on park development, we prefer they write letters. Then we can read them and consider their requests at commission meetings. We have a record of it," says Brown.

No one area in Billings is more outspoken than any others, he says.

"Requests for park development come in from time to time," he says, "but not a lot. They should go through Vern Prill, park superintendent.

Park commissioners now are

considering 24 Billings parks purchased in the last five years to see which ones will be improved first. Fourteen are undeveloped.
