

STATE HIGHWAY BUILDING AND SIX PROJECTS TO BE CONTRACTED FOR JUNE 16

Contracts on six highway projects and on the new \$145,000 highway commission building will be awarded in Helena, June 16, according to notice sent out to contractors yesterday.

Specifications for the proposed building provide for a reinforced concrete, earthquake-resisting structure, basement and two stories, with reinforced concrete walls, columns and floor construction, stucco exterior with art stone trim, built-up copper roof, solid plaster partitions, ornamental iron stairway, birch and Douglas fir interior finish, vacuum steam heating with gas-fired boiler, sanitary plumbing with copper piping, electric light and power wiring and fixtures.

Highway Projects

The following projects will be placed under contract at the June 16 letting:

- (1) Construction of a five-span 240-foot steel and concrete bridge across the Blackfoot river approximately five and a half miles northwest of Bonner on the Bonner-Ovando road in Blaine county.
- (2) Grading, surfacing with gravel, road mix oiling, and the construction of small drainage structures in the city of Burkholder beginning on Riverside avenue and extending 969 miles northwest to the junction of the north city limits with Dewey avenue.
- (3) Regrading, resurfacing and construction of small drainage structures on the Terry-Brockway road in Prairie county, beginning at the junction of U. S. highway No. 10 and the east city limits of Terry and extending 11.833 miles northwest.
- (4) Grading, surfacing, and the construction of small drainage structures on section "A" of the Great Falls-Millegan road in Cascade county, extending 3.612 miles north to a point near Bahr's ice house near the south limits of Great Falls.
- (5) Construction of the following described structures on section "A" of the Great Falls-Millegan road in Cascade county:
 - (1) A three-span 47-foot treated timber pile trestle bridge.
 - (2) A single span 25-foot bridge with reinforced abutments and treated timber deck.
 - (6) Purchasing and complete installation of five 20-ton platform scales, together with the grading and surfacing of approach driveways with road mixed oil treated crushed gravel, in the following locations: West of Missoula at the junction of U. S. highway No. 10 and U. S. highway No. 22; west of Missoula near Nisler and the junction of U. S. 10 and U. S. 91; south of Laurel near Rockvale and the junction of U. S. 210 and Montana highway No. 22; east of Miles City near the junction of U. S. 10 and U. S. 12; and in Culbertson near the north city limits on U. S. 2.

WOOLGROWERS PLAN RAM SALE FOR 1936
